Preserve America Grant: A Progress Report

The U.S Department of Interior has designated Lower Merion a *Preserve America Community* and awarded the Township a *Preserve America Grant* to fund the development of interpretive materials for the Cynwyd Heritage Trail. The Historical Society is volunteering its resources and doing the research in

support of this grant program. These signs will provide users of the trail with information about the heritage of this 19th century industrial corridor. The scope of this project is:

- (12) Twelve individual 24" x 36" interpretive signs located along the 2 1/2-mile long trail. Interpretive topics include Clegg's Mill, West Laurel Hill Station and the Pencoyd Ironworks, etc. Signage will be graphically consistent with the guidelines established by the Schuylkill River Heritage Trail.
- (5) Five 4'x6' identical trailhead signs located at Cynwyd Station, Bala Park, Barmouth, Righters Ferry Road and Rock Hill Road. Trailhead signs will include a map of the trail, an explanation of the trail and will also show connections to surrounding trails and amenities.
- (5) Five 24" x 36" interpretive panels highlighting the rail history of the trail and the renovation of Cynwyd Station. These panels will be placed at Cynwyd Station in the new vestibule and in the renovated waiting room.
